Bonnie Joyce Mosch, age 67, of Fort Collins, Colorado died January 17, 2009 after a long fight with cancer. Cremation is planned and a Mass of the Resurrection will be held at 11:00 AM Thursday, January 22, 2009 at Blessed John 23rd University Parish in Ft. Collins. Bonnie Joyce Hanish was born August 2, 1941 in Fort Dodge, Iowa to Raymond and Jane Hanish. She grew up on a farm in Iowa and graduated from Mankato State College in Mankato, Minnesota. She was a longtime member of Blessed John 23rd University Parish and is best known for being a true and genuine friend.
