Dolores Ann (Hill) Hall, 89, of Fort Collins, CO, died peacefully at home early Wednesday morning, May 26, 2021.

Dolores was born in 1931 to Merle and Stella Hill in St. Francis, Kansas, the third of their twelve children. With ten brothers and one sister, she developed her sassy, indomitable spirit. She graduated with the St. Francis High School class of 1949.

She had a wicked sense of humor, and relished sharing off-color jokes. In her later years, Dolores embraced new technology; even at 89, she helped others learn iPad skills. Her remaining family will dearly miss her, including her sister Sandra Swann; brothers Ron, Dale, Craig, Larry, and Ed Hill; daughters Dayle Towers and Becky Tyler; sons Doug and Ken Hall, and all their spouses, children, and grandchildren.
