



## Irene Colligan

June 3, 1914 - April 8, 2008

Irene S. Colligan, 93, of Fort Collins, Colorado, formerly of St. Petersburg, Florida, died April 8, 2008 after a brief illness, at Poudre Valley Hospital. She had been a resident of Woodbridge Senior Apartments of Fort Collins since March 2006. Irene Sophie Colligan was born June 3, 1914 in Mancelona, Michigan, the fourth child of John and Mattie Grosskopf.
