John bouncing his playpen off the porch landing on the sidewalk-- John caught him climbing on your roof(How he got there we will never know He wasn't over 7 years old You, Kathy and Mary coming to pick up Mary Beth many mornings when she was about 3 to take her over to your house to play. Sometimes this would be about 7:30 in the morning. I believe she had her own cold glass of orange juice waiting for her in (her) spot in your refrigerator. She had crossed Oak and Margaret Street un noticed ended up at Meyers Drug Store--and was reaching on her tip toes with her hand extended saying, "I want a coke." Most summer days your Mom and I would take all of you to the beach. All of you were assigned to carry the playpen, diapers, food bottle --what ever,. We could have stayed all night with all we had to take. Then , of course it was stopping for a A.W. root beer on the way home. Of course those were the days when I could still fit into a bathing suit Now , I would have to cut the crotch out to get one leg into the suit .lol Your Mom always stayed nice and thin with those long legs of hers. Do you remember the time when John and I moved to Palmer Street all of you helped that one day? The new house was very clean --cupboards and all. Each one of you would carry dishes or clothes from Couch Street to the car and take it into Palmer Street house where I would put it away only to go back to Couch street and repeat the process. John was shocked when he returned from golf. Many , many more memories - Wonderful memories!!!! It would be interesting to know what you remember.

Visiting with you, Kathy, on the phone made me aware of how successful you all have been and I know how proud your Mom and
