Catherine "Cathy" Siekmann, age 68 of Ft. Collins, CO, died July 5, 2011 at Poudre Valley Hospital. Together they have three living children and had suffered the loss of two others who were stillborn. Ron worked for Anheuser Busch and transferred to the new facility being built north of Fort Collins in 1987. They have lived here ever since. A member of St. Joseph Catholic Church, Cathy helped out with Religious Education and in various other capacities. She enjoyed sewing and creating lots of other crafts such as needle pointing and scrapbooking. She was the consummate mom and homemaker. She attended and was active in everything her children were involved in. She was the best cheerleader who adored her children and more recently her grandchildren.
