Connie L. Sidder, former Detroitier of Fort Collins, CO, passed away December 23, 2015.

Connie graduated from the University of Michigan in 1974. She worked as a dental hygienist and orofacial myologist in Denver, with Dr. Lyle Heimerich, and later in Fort Collins .
