He was drafted into the Army and served a tour in Nürnberg, Germany.

They were married in 1965. In 1966, Don and Carolyn moved to Denver where he earned his Bachelors' and MSBA at the University of Denver. Don had multiple careers as a CPA, an auditor and in Real Estate.
