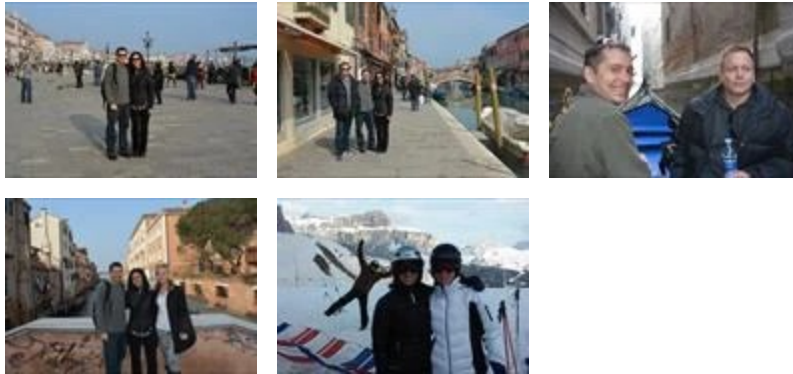

“ I have known Doug for 22 years. Initially, I worked for him after he hired me to join the mechanical design engineering team he was responsible for growing and managing. We worked side by side for about three and a half years and we developed some incredible test interface fixtures during that time. But it was always under such immense pressure to perform, and with very little room for error.

After telling Doug about my intent to part ways with the company and start my own product development company. He asked me how I felt about him teaming up with me. He revealed that he had been looking for an alternative to the job he now had, and he thought that since he and I had done so much great work together, why not keep a good thing going? It was only a day or so as I recall when we shook hands in agreement that we would become business partners.

We founded OTB Designs and Engineering, LLC in August of 2003 and we stayed at it until mid-year 2012. From day one, we never lacked work. Doug liked getting out and mixing with people so he took on the publicity duties of the company. He was good at it and in a few years, the phone rang just by word of mouth. I give Doug a lot of credit for getting our business name out there.

The work came in fast and a lot of it was hard. We got involved in some really great products and we traveled afield as needed to attend conventions, trade shows, vendors, and customer sites. In 2012, after many meetings, we agreed to part ways since we wanted different things by then. We each agreed that neither of us would have come that far by that time if it was not for the influence each of us had on the other. We parted as good friends wishing the best for each other and agreeing to stay in touch.

As time passed and we had our restaurant meetings, I was so happy and so proud of Doug. How he had found his path and what he had accomplished. He was always growing the business, sometimes quite fast. But it never really surprised me since Doug

*could not be held down.*

*Doug was warm and accommodating. Doug had a smile that was welcoming and sincere. Doug was polite and considerate. Doug believed that positive energy comes back to you and he made little room for negative energy. Doug always had a story he could share and he easily saw the humor in things.
