Elmon Clark Starr of Windsor, CO and Glastonbury, CT, died February 19, 2022. He was 89 years old and was born August. 26, 1932 in Columbus, Ohio to Elmon A. and Lela C. Starr. He married Mary Bolster in 1954 and had three children.

In 1983 he married Judith T. Hyfield of Glastonbury, Ct. Together the couple has six children, eight grandchildren and one great grandchild.

After retiring to Windsor, CO, he worked part-time at Pelican Lakes Golf Club in Water Valley, where he was also a member. He was a member of the Pelican Lakes Senior Golf League and the Northern Colorado Senior Golf Association.

He is preceded in death by his mother and father and former wife Mary Starr Carpenter.
