Edward R. Pink of Livermore, Colorado died November 26, 2014 at his ranch.

Visitation at 9:00 AM Monday at St. Joseph Catholic Church in Fort Collins immediately followed by Mass of Christian Burial at 10:00. Military honors, then a reception will conclude the service at the church. He is to be laid to rest along side his beloved wife later that day on his ranch in Livermore.

Edward Richard Pink was born April 20, 1927 in Hamtramck, Michigan to Edward and Theresa Pinkowski. He grew up in Frasier, MI and after high school went right into the Navy and served towards the end of WWII. He later attended Wayne State University, but a family emergency required him to withdraw early and go to work for the Tank Arsenal in Sterling Heights. It was there that he met his future wife, Wanda Namiotka.

Ed and Wanda were married on August 22, 1953 at St. Florian's Catholic Church in Hamtramck, MI. Together, with their family, they lived in Shelby and Leonard, MI. He worked as a packaging engineer for Chrysler Motors for many years. After his retiring in 1988, he, Wanda and son, Andrew moved to their hand selected ranch, on 80 acres, with a stream going through it, far off the main road in Livermore. It is here where they built their dream log home which borders Roosevelt National Forest.

Ed was a devout Catholic and enjoyed (greatly appreciated) the outdoors. In his down time, Ed collected stamps and spent as much time outside as he possibly could.

He was preceded in death by his parents; his sister, Kathy Betz; and his beloved wife, Wanda. Ed is survived by his son, Andrew, who has taken over the responsibilities on the ranch; two daughters, Rebecca Pink-Godin (and Edward) of Tecumseh, MI and Judy (and Greg) Moses; and three grandchildren, Megan, Eddie and Alex.
