“ Growing up Evelyn lived on a farm with her parents for a number of her younger years. She became more and more skilled and capable of helping her father do the necessary chores that had to be done, in order to make a living on a farm. She was especially helpful in caring for the livestock. She could do whatever was necessary to care for the horses and was a very skilled rider. If in a hurry she would ride the horse bare back. For a period of time her father was a dairy farmer and she was very helpful in moving the cattle from an area where they grazed to the barn where they were milked. With the help of her horse she was great at rounding up the cattle, so to speak.

At a point in time, the family had to change the location of their dairy farm. I think the distance between the old and new farm was about fifteen miles. So everything had to be moved: farm equipment, cattle, etc. Of course, Evelyn put herself and her horse on the cattle moving detail. She told the story with pride that she and her horse completed the cattle drive but she also reported that she couldn't sit down for nearly a month. Evelyn was undoubtedly my grandfather's most valuable farm hand.
