George Albert Maughan, 96, of Fort Collins, Colorado died July 10th, 2014 at his home.

In addition to farming he trained as a mechanic, and was variously engaged as a mechanic, in later years focusing on farm machinery, well into his

eighties. In 1976 he came to Fort Collins to live and work.

George is survived by three children, David (Ila) Maughan of Dodgeville, WI; Irene (Ralph) Rasmussen of Fort Collins, CO; and Fred (Bonnie) Maughan of Lancaster, WI; four grandchildren: David, Daniel, Douglas and Jeannie; and five great-grandchildren: Thomas, Hannah, Daschle, Mylerson, and Raesana.
