Helen M. Morimitsu, 84, of Fort Collins, Colorado, died February 14, 2008. A visitation will be held from 6:00 until 8:00 PM, Tuesday at Goes Funeral Care. Funeral services will be held at 11:00 AM, Wednesday at Timberline Church in the East Auditorium, 2908 Timberline Rd., Fort Collins. Interment will be held at 1:00 PM, Thursday at Roselawn Cemetery. Helen May Davis was born June 8, 1923 in Fort Collins to Hershel and Nettie Davis. She grew up here and graduated from Fort Collins High School. On July 13, 1946, Helen married Sueo "Sam" Morimitsu in Denver. She worked as a receptionist for a Fort Collins attorney and later worked at CSU. She held various administrative jobs, and retired in 1988 from the Admissions Office. She retired right about the time when the computer came on the scene. Helen's husband, Sam, and only sister, Alice Conner both died within the past year. Her son, Hershel Morimitsu and brother, Jack Davis also preceded Helen in death.
