James Woodward Joyner (Jim), 88, of Loveland, Colorado passed away Friday, November 29, 2019. He was born to Samuel Raymond Joyner and Mary Virginia Woodward in Charleston, West Virginia, May 8, 1931.

James and Eleanor were high school sweet hearts in Nitro High School, Nitro, West Virginia. James went to Menard, Texas with his dad to finish his masonry apprenticeship. Eleanor followed shortly after and they were married in Texas on September 6, 1949. After living in Texas, they lived in Lander Wyoming, Renton Washington, and eventually Loveland Colorado where they lived for 55 years.
