Jean Gail Barrera, nee Greaves, died of pancreatic cancer in Fort Collins, CO on March 13, 2015. She was 65 years old.

Born January 13, 1950 in Brooklyn, NY, she grew up in Broomfield, CO and spent her earlier years living in San Diego, CA and Keenesburg, CO before settling in Fort Collins in 1990. She worked toward social justice for the homeless and disabled as a volunteer coordinator for Catholic Charities Northern and Disabled Resources until retiring in 2012. She enjoyed spending her time gardening, entertaining, reading in the sunshine, and spending time with her dogs and family. She will be well remembered for her sparkling eyes, beautiful smile, excellent cooking, remarkable talent in making a home, and service to others. She is survived by her stepmother Dorothy Greaves of Broomfield, CO, her son Matthew Hyland of Seattle, WA, and her daughter Jaime Brede of Breckenridge, CO.
