John S. Cupery, age 70 of Fort Collins, CO formerly of Denver, died April 17, 2010 after struggling with progressive supra-nuclear palsy. A funeral service, with full military honors will be held at 1:00 PM Wednesday, April 21 at Fort Logan National Cemetery, Staging Area 'A', 4400 West Kenyon Ave., Denver, CO 80236. John Samuel Cupery was born June 17, 1939 in Valley Springs, SD to Charles and Plona Cupery. He grew up in Beaver Creek, MN and enlisted in the Army in 1961. He also lived in Sioux Falls, SD and Corona, CA, prior to settling in Denver. He retired from Smurfit Stone Container as plant superintendent after 42 years with the company. He also enjoyed dancing and watching various sports, especially the Broncos and Rockies.
