Judith (Judy) A. Hill went to be with her Lord at age 81 on Monday, November 29, 2021 at Medical Center of the Rockies in Loveland, Colorado. She died peacefully after a courageous weeks long battle with Covid-19. Born in 1940 in Brooklyn, New York to parents John and Mildred Hornung. Judy liked to share memories of growing up on Long island, the youngest of 3 children. Later the family moved to Detroit, Michigan where Judith attended Redford High School and Michigan State University. At college she met Buryl Hill and they were married in Lansing Michigan. She was an amazing home maker to four children. Judith cared deeply about the well-being of those less fortunate. Judith gave her time to teaching Sunday school at Calvin Presbyterian church and volunteering for HUD in Detroit. The marriage later ended in divorce, after which Judith attended nursing school and graduated with honors from Sinai-Grace Nursing school in 1976.

As a nurse, Judith worked in dialysis at Ford Hospital in Detroit and eventually she had a long career as an ICU nurse at Hemet Hospital in Hemet, California. She loved taking care of her patients and had a determination to make them comfortable and help them understand the treatment they were getting. She attended young and old with a servant's heart. Judith also answered the call to be a missionary by taking several opportunities to administer pray and medicine in Guatemala, Mexico, and the Philippines. She devoted herself to service of the Lord Jesus Christ and visited Israel in the

1990's. She retired from nursing in 1999 and moved to Ft. Collins, Colorado to be closer to her son, Buryl (Bob) Hill and his three children. Grammy's house was the gathering place for special occasions, always open and always full of home cooking and treats. Many treasured memories were created there.

Judith took her service to the Lord very seriously and was grateful to devote herself to converting to Catholicism and to belonging to the Carmelites. She loved regularly volunteering at the local soup kitchen and visiting friends at area nursing homes. We all know Judith as a prayer warrior. Her children and grandchildren do not take it for granted that she said daily prayers for our well-being and will continue to pray for us always and forever. She was a gift and a bright light to all who knew her. In Ft. Collins, Judith and her eldest daughter, Cheryl, signed up to be tutors through a program at CSU and a local church for Chinese students who wanted to improve English language skills and learn more about American culture. In true Judith fashion, with her heart of gold, these 'students' became a part of her extended family and each one now call her their American mom. Judith enjoyed needle crafts and could be found on the couch with her kittens cuddled up knitting for charities, friends and family.

Judith is survived by her four children, Cheryl Sanderhill, Salt Lake City, Buryl (Bob) Hill and wife Linda, Ft. Collins, Eva Redford, Ft. Collins, Diana Wright and husband Doug, Durango, CO. She leaves behind seven beautiful grandchildren ages 31-18, Austin Redford, Chad Hill, Garrett Redford, Natalie Hill, Cody Hill, Chloe Redford, and Roman Speegle. She greatly enjoyed her 3 great grandchildren as well. Judith is also survived by her older sister Janet Kitchen (Brighton, Michigan) and Cousin Sandy (California). She was preceded in death by her first husband, Buryl (Bus) Hill, her brother, John Hornung II and her parents.

Services will commence at St. John XXIII on 1220 University Ave, Fort Collins, CO 80521 on Friday, December 10, 2021 3PM and Saturday, December 11,

2021 at 10AM. Interment will be at a later date.

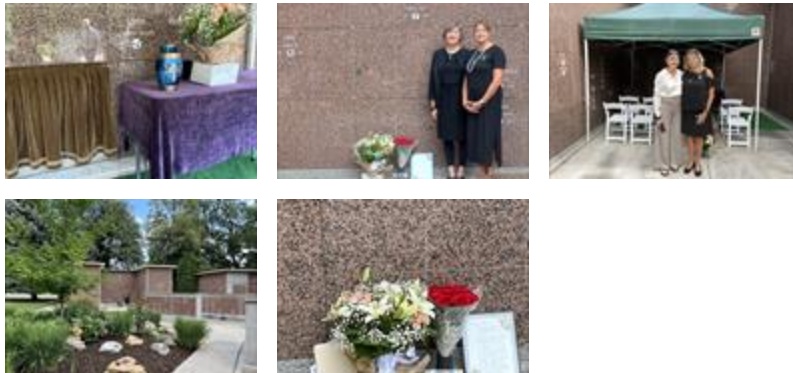

“ A Letter to Judith

Dear Judith:

When I first came to America, you're one of the people to welcome us to this country. We first met in ESL class organized by churches in Fort Collins. You're the one taught me how to speak English, reading Bible with my broken English...besides that, you also taught me how to cook traditional American food, how to manage my marriage. The wedding gift you gave me is the book – Staring your Marriage Right. I still remember you told me "if someone showed me this book and the right order of Love when I was young, I won't make that many mistakes...so I wish you could learn and keep your marriage fresh." On the day that we moved to South Dakota, you brought bagels to our apartment and shared the ordinary American breakfast with my family and even gave us \$100 for moving expense on the road. You're so kind and considerable. I still kept the clothes you crochet for my kids (a blue blanket and a pretty pink outfit), they're so soft and pretty and we will pass down your love to our next generations.

After we moved back to Colorado, I felt our relationship changed dramatically from teacher-student to friend, now to family. I was getting used to not planning anything during holidays, because I know you will always send me messages before Independence Day and Thanksgiving and invite us to join your family for those holidays. You still kept my kids' drawings on the first July 4th we returned to Colorado, so you will show us or your family the good memories you had with us. I still remember the good game time in our gathering of 2019 Thanksgiving and Christmas. Those are the valuable moments we spent together. Everyone in my family are all spoiled by your cards, because we know everyone will receive Birthday card from you on our birthdays and every holidays like Easter, Thanksgiving etc. Kids still kept your birthday gift money in their piggy banks, and always proud to have an Aunt like you. Your stuffed animals are still their favorite ones to help them fall in sleep

every night. Finally I finished counting all the cards you sent over the years, with a total of 41 cards. Kids always “complain” that it is hard to read your cursive, but now, our family read them again together and everyone was touched by your kind and love words. I really appreciate you drove down from Fort Collins and gave us support during my father’s funeral. Now we will miss all your cards, I don’t know who to call whenever I need to talk to someone. I still have a lot to share with you and I missed “I love you, honey” whenever I hang up phone. I need to do things better to catch up: call you more often, show you kids piano pieces and art...Damn COVID that your time with us was shortened.

Your kindness and faith totally changed my view of this world, you’re one of the friends that showed me what is God, why we need to understand Bible and eventually lead my way to believe God. Your lovely personality set up such a great role model for our lives and help me reinforce conservative American values.

You’re part of our family and surely will remain a special spot in our hearts, we all love you and will remember you forever. It is hard to say goodbye especially from me who enjoyed your friendship, your kindness and your faithfulness, but I know you’re in much better place now.
