Larry Vernon Connors, age 82, passed away peacefully on January 11, 2025, at Poudre Valley Hospital in Fort Collins, Colorado, due to complications following cardiac arrest. 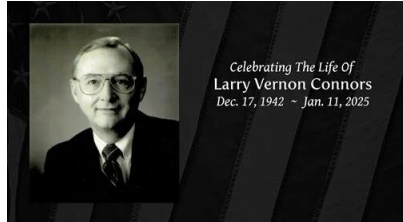
