She grew up and lived in Fowler until 1990 when she, her husband, and a small herd of cattle moved to Fort Collins, Colorado where she passed away at home under the loving care of her adult children and husband, Salvador, on Tuesday, December 28, 2021.

Mom and Dad married on December 20, 1948 and were together for 73 years. Dad knew she was the one from the first time he saw her. She stood out for how hard of a worker she was and for her singing voice while working. We have many memories of Mom singing the old and contemporary Mexican “Rancheras” and “Corridos” solo and with Dad in harmony. Singing was a gift she shared with family and friends. She continued to sing and hum until her voice became silent.

Mom’s greatest love and joy were being a Mother, Grandmother, and Aunt. Make no mistake, she was not an angel, she was not perfect. In a note she wrote to us, she admitted that she knew we did not always like her “old fashioned” parenting skills. While that was true, she succeeded in instilling in us to be hard working, respectful, responsible, and decent individuals. She also stressed the importance of setting and achieving goals and to never give up. As she would say in Spanish, “no te rajes”. She taught us well.

Mom loved her entire family. She always remembered and prayed for her parents and siblings who passed before her and had a special place in her big heart for her nephews and nieces. To many, she was their “favorite Aunt”, the aunt they could seek out for advice, share problems with, or just enjoy spending time with her. And no one who came to visit could leave the house and say good bye without receiving her special blessing.

She is fondly remembered for being fun loving, generous, caring, feisty, self-confident, forever young, and a very strong and independent woman. She had a sweet tooth for pies, cakes and cookies and savored her daily serving of vanilla ice cream. Mom was an animal lover having had numerous dogs and cats. Her two favorites were Linus (dog) and a stray cat, Sam, that Mom and her granddaughter Carisa brought into the family. She was an avid sports fan of the Denver Broncos, the Colorado State Rams and the Colorado Rockies. She enjoyed watching ball games on TV and a few times at Coors Field but never forgave the Rockies for trading Galarraga.

Mom loved her family and our love for her will be forever. She was preceded in death by her parents, her first born infant son, Juan Ramon, siblings Frank, Consuelo Ramirez (Juan), Ruth Flores (Sam), Manual, Salvador, Louise, and in January 2021 by her beloved granddaughter, Carisa Kohutek (we know they are playfully arguing with each other in Heaven over who is prettier).
