



## Quin Morrison

November 17, 1938 - December 18, 2015

Quin Morrison, age 77, passed away on Friday, December 18, 2015 in Pathways Hospice Care in Fort Collins, Colorado. He was surrounded by several family members. He was born November 17, 1938 in Homewood, Illinois to Arthur and Selma (Lentz) Morrison.

He developed a passion for broadcasting early in life, which he followed after graduating from Thornton Township High School in 1956. He was drafted into the Army from 1962-1964 and was stationed in North Carolina. After he finally settled in Windsor, Colorado in 1969, where he helped build many radio stations including KUAD. 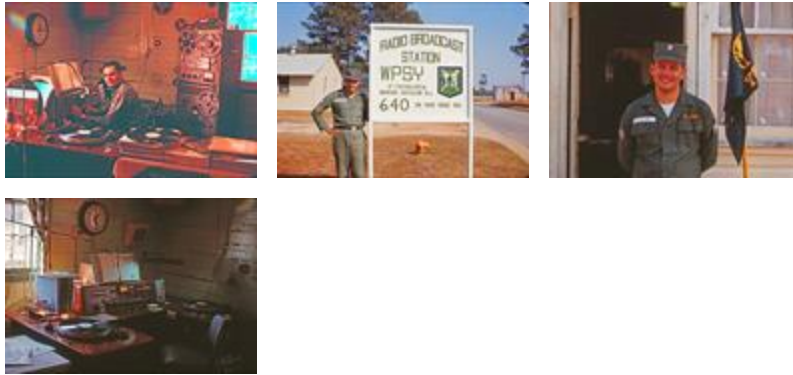
