In his early day, he spent time helping his parents on their farm. He became a welder in the Liberty shipyards in California on Terminal Island during World War II. When he returned to Fort Collins in 1945, he was a master welder for Ideal Basic Cement Co. in LaPorte. Upon his retirement after 34 years with Ideal, he drove school buses for Poudre R-1 School District for 3 years. Roy married the love of his life in 1942, Rhodabelle Cutshall, who survives him. Roy and Rhodabelle raised five daughters, Faye Davis, Victoria Cooley (Dave), Linda Palmer (Frank), Bonnie Vail, and Sandy Bailey.
