Scott "Scooter" Larm, age 40 of Ft. Collins, CO died March 8, 2010 at Poudre Valley Hospital. Cremation has been completed and a celebration of his life will be held at 10:00 am Saturday, March 13th at First Baptist Church, 900 East Prospect Rd., Ft. Collins. Scott Allen Larm was born March 8, 1970 in Denver. He lived in Ft. Collins all of his life and graduated from Rocky Mountain High School in 1989. While in High School he was a Golden Glove Boxer.
