After graduation he went to work in Lander on a ranch and rode bulls all over

Wyoming and Colorado. Then it was off to Pueblo, Co. working as an electricians apprentice and of course riding bulls all over the state.

After a year in Pueblo he would move to Craig, Co and work at Big O. During the Meeker rodeo series he would experience a bad bull wreck leaving him unable to drive home; this is where he met his girl friend Kayla Pinnt.
